Mark Taylor, Vice President of the Historical Society, will present a talk on “Stonewall Jackson” at the next Quarterly Meeting.

The meeting will be held at 2:00 pm on April 14th, Sunday afternoon, at Cooks Old Mill, one quarter mile west of Greenville on route 122. In addition, the Omnibus, the subject of our recent fundraising campaign, will be on view at the mill. Please note that in the future, quarterly meetings will be held on the second Sunday of January, April, July and October, that is, one month later than in the past.

Stonewall Jackson is arguably West Virginia’s most famous son. This May marks the 150th anniversary of his death. He became a legend as commander of the Stonewall Brigade in which many of the men and boys of Monroe County served during the Civil War. While most are familiar with the military exploits of General Jackson, the personal Tom Jackson is little known. Hear stories of his life and impact off the battlefield from Mark Taylor on Sunday afternoon.

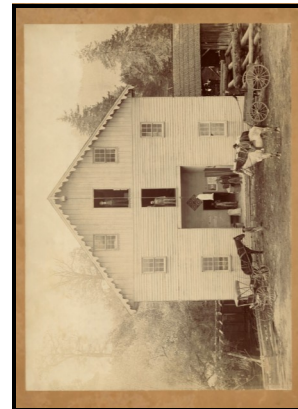
