

Carriage House Progress



The calendar says "spring" but the weather hasn't made up its' mind yet. So, as we await spring weather to finish construction on our Carriage House, we continue to add horse drawn vehicles to the collection which will be housed there. Also, we are very pleased to announce the donation of three more horse-drawn vehicles to our carriage and wagon collection. Avery Atkins has donated a John Deere Farm Wagon, and Bill Guy has donated a sleigh (or cutter) and a buckboard. These latter two vehicles are originally from the collection of Raymond Spencer a former Agricultural Agent in Monroe County. More will be published on all these vehicles when pictures are available. The significance of these donations is that they will round out our collection and make it representative of the types of vehicles used in Monroe County. We are still interested in receiving


more vehicles and of special importance would be a two-wheeled buggy (or gig) and a goat cart as these are known to have been used in this area. We are still getting requests for the purchase of commemorative bricks to be installed in the porch of the Carriage House. So, if you are interested, you can have your names, or the names of loved ones engraved on a brick for \$100.00. Each brick can contain three lines of thirteen characters each (letters or spaces) and this is sufficient for two or three names. Your order should be sent to the Monroe County Historical Society at PO Box 465, Union, WV 24983.

Finishing touches on the Carriage House are expected by early summer. Plans are now underway for a rousing summer dedication ceremony. Watch for a Carriage House dedication date coming soon.

Thanks to all who have contributed to make this Carriage House possible. We encourage your continued financial support through contributions as much still remains to be done to bring this project to completion. With your continued help we will now be

able to preserve and display artifacts of Monroe County's horse drawn history for generations to come.
